Lesson 1

**The Occasion and Outline of Revelation –
The Account of a Vision that the Apostle John had Concerning the Future
Revelation 1**

doctrinal points

1. The Book of Revelation concerns the revelation of Jesus Christ.
2. The Book of Revelation concerns the revelation of the future.

practical application

Expect to be blessed as you study Revelation.

questions

1. Who wrote the book of Revelation, where, and when?
2. Why is Sunday referred to as the “Lord’s Day”?
3. Where would the seven churches of Asia be located on a modern map?
4. What is the difference between being raised from the dead and being resurrected?
5. Why will all the tribes of the earth mourn (verse 7)?
6. How is Revelation 1:19 an outline for the book of Revelation?

answers

1. Revelation was written by the Apostle John. John was exiled to the island of Patmos because of his testimony as a Christian. It was on this island, near the end of his life (about 95 AD), that John received the vision from the Lord, which is this book.
2. That was the day of the Lord's resurrection.
3. The Roman province of Asia was where Turkey is today.
4. Someone who is raised from the dead will eventually die again. But anyone who has been resurrected receives a new glorified body – never to die again.
5. Because the Lord is coming back in judgment. He is coming back to set up His long-awaited kingdom on this earth.
6.
 - *"The things which you have seen"* would be what John has already seen in the vision and recorded in Chapter 1.
 - *"The things which are"* would be Chapters 2-3 where the present state of the Church is seen in the letters to the seven churches.
 - *"The things which shall take place after this"* would be Chapters 4-19 which describe the judgments of the future Tribulation Period as well as Chapters 20-22 which describe future events into eternity.

discuss\ consider

1. This first chapter of Revelation has much to say about Jesus Christ. What does it say about Him and His role in the future?
2. Why do we believe that most of the events recorded in Revelation are still future? Describe the Preterist view of the book of Revelation.

challenge

The Lord promises a blessing to the reader of Revelation. Be encouraged as you read and study this book.

memorize

"The Revelation of Jesus Christ, which God gave Him to show His servants." Revelation 1:1

"I am the Alpha and the Omega, the Beginning and the End," says the Lord, 'who is and who was and who is to come, the Almighty.'" Revelation 1:8

Lesson 2

The Message to the First Two Church of Asia – The Church of Ephesus and the Church of Smyrna Revelation 2:1-11

doctrinal points

1. The Church of Ephesus represents the church that has left its first love.
2. The Church of Smyrna represents the persecuted church.

practical application

Let's be overcomers!

questions

1. Review the vision John saw in Revelation 1.
2. Review three ways in which these messages to the seven churches can be applied.
3. Which New Testament characters ministered at the Church of Ephesus?
4. What is unique about the Church and city of Smyrna?
5. Which famous early Christian was martyred at Smyrna?

answers

1. John saw the Lord standing in the midst of seven golden lampstands, which represented seven first century churches. The awesome appearance of the Lord conveys His total authority and shows that He will judge everyone on the basis of His word.
2. First, they describe the conditions that literally existed in those seven first century churches. So they had application to those churches. Secondly, the messages can be applied to any church at any time. There is challenge, exhortation, comfort, and encouragement which certainly apply to us today. A third option is that the messages to the seven churches each represent a stage in Church history.
3. The Apostle Paul spent two-and-a-half years there during his third missionary journey. Timothy was shepherding this church when Paul wrote 1 Timothy. The Apostle John was at this church before his exile to the island of Patmos.
4. Smyrna is the only one of the seven churches where a continuous Christian testimony has been maintained since the first century. Smyrna is the modern city of Ismir, Turkey, today.
5. Polycarp

discuss\ consider

1. How can you recognize false teaching in your church? What is the best defense against “leaving your first love” as the Church of Ephesus did?
2. Have you ever endured persecution for your faith? Many Christians around the world are facing persecution. What encouragement could they gain from the message to the church of Smyrna?

challenge

How is your love for the Lord? Is it as strong as when you were first saved? Be challenged by the message to the Ephesians. Rekindle your first love.

memorize

“Nevertheless I have this against you, that you have left your first love. Remember therefore from where you have fallen; repent and do the first works.” Revelation 2:4-5

“He who has an ear, let him hear what the Spirit says to the churches.” Revelation 2:7, 11

Lesson 3

The Messages of the Third and Fourth Church of Asia – The Church of Pergamum and the Church of Thyatira Revelation 2:12-29

doctrinal points

1. The Church at Pergamum represents the compromising church.
2. The Church at Thyatira represents the church that tolerates false doctrine.

practical application

Go for the white stone and the morning star.

questions

1. Where are the seven churches of Revelation located?
2. What was the good news for Pergamum?
3. Who was Balaam?
4. What was the bad news for Pergamum?
5. What false teaching was tolerated by the Church at Thyatira?
6. Who are the overcomers?

answers

1. These churches were located in the Roman Provinces of Asia, where the country of Turkey is located today.
2. The Church at Pergamum was commended for not denying the name of Christ even in the face of persecution and in the midst of pagan surroundings.
3. Balaam was a false prophet or diviner in the Old Testament who showed Balak, king of Moab, how to seduce the men of Israel and get them involved in idolatry and sexual immorality with the women of Moab.
4. The Church of Pergamum was guilty of compromising in the areas of teaching and morality.
5. The teaching that Christians could engage in fornication and participate in the pagan festivals and yet be free from sinning.
6. The overcomers are committed Christians who do not compromise in their faith and do not tolerate false doctrine.

discuss\ consider

1. Discuss the relative and changing standards of secular society. God's standards do not change, because they are based on His unchanging Word. Is this a comfort or a conviction to you?
2. Discuss the rewards given to overcomers in this section. Discuss the hidden manna, the white stone, and the morning star. Will you partake of these special rewards?

memorize

"You allow that woman Jezebel, who calls herself a prophetess, to teach and seduce My servants to commit sexual immorality and eat things sacrificed to idols." Revelation 2:20

"All the churches shall know that I am He who searches the minds and hearts. And I will give to each one of you according to your works." Revelation 2:23

Lesson 4

The Messages to the Final Three Churches of Asia – The Church at Sardis, the Church at Philadelphia, and the Church at Laodicea Revelation 3

doctrinal points

1. The Church at Sardis represents the lifeless church.
2. The Church at Philadelphia represents the faithful church.
3. The Church at Laodicea represents the lukewarm church.

practical application

Don't just attend church!

questions

1. Who were the “angels” or messengers of the seven churches of Asia?
2. Is Revelation 3:5 teaching that a believer’s salvation can be lost?
3. Which two of the seven churches did not receive a rebuke from the Lord?
4. How was the church at Philadelphia faithful?
5. What is the proper application of Revelation 3:20?

answers

1. While this may refer to special guardian angels appointed to protect each of the churches, they are more likely the human leaders of the local churches. These men were to read the letter that had been sent to their church and convey the message to the people of that church.
2. No, many other Scriptures teach the eternal security of the believer. This verse confirms the truth of perseverance of the saints: true believers will persevere and overcome and those who persevere and overcome are true believers.
3. Smyrna – the persecuted church, and Philadelphia – the faithful church
4. They kept the Word of the Lord and did not deny His name.
5. This verse is speaking about having communion and fellowship with the Lord.

discuss\ consider

1. Have you known any churches or Christians who were lifeless like Sardis? How do we keep this from happening to ourselves and our church? Read Revelation 3:2-5 for the answer.
2. The church of Laodicea is similar to many professing Christians in the Church today – apathetic, half-hearted, unconcerned, indifferent, lukewarm. Read Revelation 3:4-21. The true believers are exhorted to live righteously and find their sufficiency in close communion with Christ.

challenge

Do you just attend church, or are you a vital member of your church? Hold on to what you have and strengthen what remains!

memorize

“Be watchful, and strengthen the things which remain... Remember therefore how you have received and heard; hold fast and repent.” Revelation 3:2-3

“See, I have set before you an open door, and no one can shut it.” Revelation 3:8

“He who has an ear, let him hear what the Spirit says to the churches.” Revelation 3:6, 13, 22

Lesson 5

John is Caught up into Heaven and Sees the Throne of God Revelation 4

doctrinal points

1. In Revelation 4 the Rapture of the Church is implied.
2. In Revelation 4 the throne of God is presented.

practical application

Praise the Lord, for the Sea of Glass like crystal.

questions

1. Recall the basic outline of John's Revelation.
2. How does Revelation 4 fit into this outline?
3. According to the pretribulational view, what is the next event on God's prophetic calendar?
4. How is the Rapture of the Church implied in Revelation 4?
5. What does the emerald around the throne symbolize?

answers

1. The things which are; The things which shall be hereafter (Revelation 1:19)
2. This chapter is the transition to events which will be in the future. Specifically, chapters 4-19 cover the Tribulation period.
3. The Rapture – the Lord’s return for His Church, followed by the 7 year Tribulation period.
4. John is suddenly transported to heaven and the Church is in heaven preparing for the Marriage of the Lamb.
5. That God keeps His covenants with His people forever.

discuss\ consider

1. Compare the vision of the four living creatures here to the cherubim in Ezekiel 10 and the seraphim in Isaiah 6. Cherubim and Seraphim are classes of high ranking angels.
2. Read the praises given to God in verses 8 and 11. What praises do these inspire in your heart?

challenge

In heaven we will find a sea of glass like crystal. This is not a sea that can get stormy and dangerous; this sea of glass portrays undisturbed peace forever. Look forward to that peace to come.

memorize

“Come up here, and I will show you things which must take place after this.” Revelation 4:1

“Holy, holy, holy, Lord God Almighty, Who was and is and is to come!” Revelation 4:8

“You are worthy, O Lord, to receive glory and honor and power; For You created all things, and by Your will they exist and were created.” Revelation 4:11

Lesson 6

**The Song of the Redeemed Giving Praise to the Lamb of God
Revelation 5**

doctrinal points

1. The Lord Jesus is worthy to open the book of future judgment.
2. The Lord Jesus will be worshiped when the book of future judgment is opened.

practical application

Get ready for the thrill of universal praise!

questions

1. Where does the vision of Revelation 5 take place?
2. What does the scroll with the seven seals represent?
3. Who was the only one worthy to open the scroll?
4. In what two ways is the Lord Jesus presented in this chapter?
5. How will Philippians 2:10 be fulfilled in this vision?

answers

1. In heaven, before the throne of God
2. The scroll is a book of judgment. As each seal is broken, a judgment takes place on earth during the future Tribulation period.
3. *“The Lion of the tribe of Judah”* – the Lord Jesus Christ
4. As the Lion (verse 5) and the Lamb (verse 6).
5. From verses 11-14 we see that the praise of heaven becomes universal honor for God and the Lamb. Verse 13 shows that every knee will bow, acknowledge, and honor Him.

discuss\ consider

1. Discuss how Jesus Christ prevailed and triumphed, and is thus qualified to bring judgment on this earth.
2. Review the truths proclaimed in our Redemption Song (Revelation 5:9-10). This is the song of the redeemed, that we as believers will sing in eternity.

challenge

If you are emotionally exhilarated this week by a shout or cheer of celebration with others, stop and think about the universal praise we will hear for the Lord who redeemed us!

memorize

“Do not weep. Behold, the Lion of the tribe of Judah, the Root of David, has prevailed to open the scroll and to loose its seven seals.” Revelation 5:5

“Worthy is the Lamb who was slain to receive power and riches and wisdom, and strength and honor and glory and blessing!” Revelation 5:11

“Blessing and honor and glory and power be to Him who sits on the throne, and to the Lamb, forever and ever!” Revelation 5:13

Lesson 7

The First Six Seals of the Scroll of God's Judgment Opened by the Lamb of God Revelation 6

doctrinal point

1. The seven seals represent judgments of the Tribulation Period.
 - 1) The first seal involves cold war.
 - 2) The second seal involves open warfare.
 - 3) The third seal involves famine.
 - 4) The fourth seal involves much death.
 - 5) The fifth seal involves martyred saints.
 - 6) The sixth seal involves cosmic and geologic disturbances.

practical application

Believe God's Word now or face God's wrath later.

questions

1. What does the seven-sealed scroll represent? Who alone can open this scroll?
2. How does our Lord's Olivet Discourse in Matthew 24-25 relate to Revelation 6?
3. Who is the rider on the white horse in Revelation 6:2?
4. What is the meaning of Revelation 6:8?
5. How does the scene of John's vision change with the fifth seal?

answers

1. The scroll was symbolic of God's judgment to come upon this earth in the future Tribulation period. The Lord Jesus Christ, the Lion of Judah, is the only One worthy to open this scroll of judgment.
2. Our Lord's prophecy in Matthew has many parallels with the scroll judgments here. In Matthew 24:29, the Lord describes these events as happening in the Great Tribulation.
3. This is not the Lord, who rides on a white horse in Revelation 19. On the contrary, this first horseman of the Apocalypse is the notorious world leader who first appears as a man of peace.
4. A fourth of the earth's remaining population will be killed under this seal of judgment, through more war, famine, plagues, and wild animals.
5. In the fifth seal John saw under an altar in heaven the souls of believers who have been martyred during the Tribulation.

discuss\ consider

1. Review each of the seven seal judgments. This will all literally take place. Does it strengthen your faith to think of God's hand working so clearly to bring about His will?

challenge

Political power, military might, or wealth will not protect anyone from the wrath of God to come. Have you been trying to hide from God? Turn to Him now, before it is too late.

memorize

"How long, O Lord, holy and true, until You judge and avenge our blood on those who dwell on the earth?" Revelation 6:10

"Fall on us and hide us from the face of Him who sits on the throne and from the wrath of the Lamb! For the great day of His wrath has come, and who is able to stand?" Revelation 6:16-17

Lesson 8

An Interlude Between the Sixth and Seventh Seals of Judgment Revelation 7

doctrinal points

1. There will be 144,000 Jewish evangelists during the Tribulation period.
2. There will be many thousands of Gentile converts during the Tribulation period.

practical application

Don't be too dogmatic about the details.

questions

1. How does Revelation 7 fit into the context of the chapters around it?
2. When during the seven year Tribulation period, will the seal judgments occur?
3. Who specifically are the 144,000 witness described in this chapter?
4. How does Romans 11 relate to this passage in Revelation?
5. Who are the great multitude of saved Gentiles described in verses 9-14?

answers

1. In Revelation 6 John saw six of the seven seal judgments that will take place during the future Tribulation period. This chapter is an interlude, before the seventh seal judgment is described in Revelation 8.
2. The seal judgments will take place during the first half of the Tribulation, as the *“beginning of sorrows”* (Matthew 24:8).
3. They are Jewish evangelists, 12,000 from each of the 12 tribes of Israel.
4. Romans 11 (and many Old Testament prophecies) foretell a great spiritual revival in the nation of Israel. Israel has been temporarily set aside during the present time of the Church age, but after the Rapture God will raise up a godly remnant of Jews, some of whom will be the 144,000 witnesses.
5. These are the saved Gentiles of the Tribulation period who live through the Tribulation and enter the Millennial Kingdom of the Lord on earth.

discuss\ consider

1. Since the Church will be in heaven during the Tribulation period, these 144,000 witnesses are not from the Church. They are Jewish evangelists who are converted during the Tribulation. Why is this an important point?
2. There are many groups of people described in John’s Revelation, and it is easy to get them confused. Review each of these people groups, who and where they are during the Tribulation:
 - The Church
 - The 144,000 Jewish Evangelists
 - The Martyred Tribulation Saints
 - The Gentile Tribulation Saints

challenge

There are many details involved in John’s vision. While we can seek to understand these details, we should not be too dogmatic about our opinion. Be gracious as you study Revelation together.

memorize

“One hundred and forty-four thousand of all the tribes of the children of Israel were sealed.” Revelation 7:4

“Behold, a great multitude which no one could number, of all nations, tribes, peoples, and tongues, standing before the throne and before the Lamb” Revelation 7:9

Lesson 9

The Seventh and Final Seal and the Scroll Judgment Opened & The First Four Trumpet Judgments Revelation 8

doctrinal points

1. The first trumpet judgment involves burning on the earth.
2. The second trumpet judgment involves upheaval in the sea.
3. The third trumpet judgment involves poisoning of the waters.
4. The fourth trumpet judgment involves catastrophe in the heavens.

practical application

Thank the Lord for the added incense.

questions

1. List the three series of Judgments that will occur during the Tribulation period.
2. On what basis do we say the future Tribulation period will last seven years?
3. What do we call the second 3 ½ years of the Tribulation period?
4. What is a probable explanation for “*a great mountain burning with fire thrown into the sea*” (verse 8)?
5. Who is the angel in verses 3-5?

answers

1. The Seal Judgments, the Trumpet Judgments, and the Bowl Judgments
2. Based on the prophetic vision of Daniel 9, which foretells 70 weeks. Most of this vision has already been fulfilled, but the last week of the vision is still future. The 70th week, like the first 69 in Hebrew is a week of 7 years, not 7 days.
3. The Great Tribulation
4. An asteroid in our solar system colliding with the earth and crashing into the ocean
5. It is the Lord Himself standing before the throne of God the Father and offering up the prayers of believers before God. No mere angel or saint could do that; only our Great High Priest, the Lord Jesus Christ.

discuss\ consider

1. Discuss how the plagues on Egypt (Exodus 7-12) were a preview of the Trumpet Judgments in the Tribulation period. Just as those plagues were literal, so these will be too.

challenge

In the Lord's role as our Great High Priest, He offers our prayers before God and makes them acceptable and pleasing to Him. Even when you're not sure exactly what to pray, you can pray thanking the Lord that He intercedes on your behalf.

memorize

"When He opened the seventh seal, there was silence in heaven for about half an hour. And I saw the seven angels who stand before God, and to them were given seven trumpets." Revelation 8:1-2

Lesson 10

The Fifth and Sixth Trumpet Judgments Revelation 9

doctrinal points

1. The Fifth Trumpet Judgment involves opening the abyss.
2. The Sixth Trumpet Judgment involves releasing a great army.

practical application

Don't think that pain necessarily leads to repentance.

questions

1. When do we believe these trumpet judgments will occur?
2. What is apocalyptic literature?
3. What does the star in Revelation 9:1 represent?
4. Where is Satan now? What is the abyss?
5. What is the toll on mankind following these judgments?

answers

1. During the last 3 1/2 years of the Tribulation Period, known as the Great Tribulation
2. Apocalyptic literature involves visions concerning the future. This style of literature is highly symbolic, but it is not all symbolic.
3. The star is symbolic of an angel – probably Satan himself (see Revelation 12:12).
4. At the present time, Satan is not in hell. He is free to roam about the earth and has access to heavenly realms. The abyss or bottomless pit is not hell, but many demons are confined there (Luke 8:31-32). There Satan will be bound for 1000 years during our Lord's future millennial kingdom (Revelation 20:1).
5. Following the sixth trumpet judgment, the death toll rises to 1/3 of mankind. Combined with the death tolls of the other judgments, at least 1/2 of the world's population will have perished at this point in the Tribulation Period.

discuss\ consider

1. Discuss the dilemma of interpreting apocalyptic literature with its highly symbolic language. How do you work to interpret these passages as literally as possible?
2. We tend to think that if an unbeliever experiences enough pain he will turn to God and repent. We see this is certainly not the case in the Tribulation Period (see Revelation 9:20-21). Discuss why pain does not necessarily lead to repentance. What does cause repentance?

challenge

Recall the point in your life when you were brought to repentance and trusted Christ. Praise the Lord for this!

memorize

"In those days men will seek death and will not find it; they will desire to die, and death will flee from them." Revelation 9:6

"They had as king over them the angel of the bottomless pit, whose name in Hebrew is Abaddon, but in Greek he has the name Apollyon." Revelation 9:11

Lesson 11

**The Presentation of an Open Little Scroll
in the Hand of a Strong Angel Coming Down from Heaven
Revelation 10**

doctrinal points

1. The details of God's future judgments are not fully revealed.
2. The details of God's future judgments are sweet and bitter.

practical application

Praise the Lord! There will be not evolutionists in the kingdom.

questions

1. Review the presentation of the scroll sealed up with seven seals from Revelation 5.
2. Who is the strong angel described in Revelation 10:1?
3. What important transition occurs in this chapter?
4. What is the mystery of God in verse 7?

answers

6. This scroll was a book describing the coming judgments of the future Tribulation Period. As each seal was opened, different judgments and conditions of the Tribulation Period were described in detail.
7. This strong angel may be the Lord Himself appearing as an angel in John's vision.
8. The sounding of the seventh trumpet of judgment brings us close to the end of the Tribulation Period. Even though the bowl judgments follow, they are rapid in succession or they may even overlap with the Trumpet Judgments.
9. The mystery of God concerns all the truth about God and His glorious kingdom on earth with Christ as King. This truth was largely communicated to the Old Testament prophets, but they did not completely comprehend all that they wrote under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit (1 Peter 1:10-12).

discuss\ consider

1. As we study apocalyptic literature, such as John's Revelation, it is important to remember, "The details of God's future judgments are not fully revealed." Discuss the implications of this. Refer to Daniel 12:1,4,9; Deuteronomy 29:29; and 2 Timothy 3:16-17.
2. Discuss how the study of prophecy can be sweet and bitter.

challenge

When you study prophecy, do you find a balance between excitement and fascination and the sober reality of God's judgment?

memorize

"In the days of the sounding of the seventh angel, when he is about to sound, the mystery of God would be finished." Revelation 10:7

"Then I took the little book out of the angel's hand and ate it, and it was as sweet as honey in my mouth. But when I had eaten it, my stomach became bitter." Revelation 10:10

Lesson 12

**The Tribulation Temple, The Two Witnesses, & The Seventh Trumpet
Revelation 11**

doctrinal points

1. There are two temples to be built on this earth in the future.
2. There are two witness to appear on this earth in the future.

practical application

Remember, you are immortal until your work on earth is over.

questions

1. What were the three woes pronounced on those who dwell on the earth (Revelation 8:13)?
2. How long is 42 months? How long is 1260 days?
3. Does verse 19 mean that the actual Ark of the Covenant resides in heaven?
4. Name the two temples to be built on this earth in the future.
5. Who are these two witnesses? List the various suggestions.

answers

1. The three woes are the last three trumpet judgments. The sounding of the seventh trumpet brings us to the end of the Tribulation Period and the beginning of Christ's earthly kingdom.
2. 42 months is the last 3 1/2 years of the Tribulation Period, often called the Great Tribulation. 1260 days is 3 1/2 years calculating with a 30 day Hebrew month.
3. Probably not; the Ark of the Covenant signifies God's loyal presence among His people. The meaning of the Ark seen in the Temple of God is heaven is that the way into God's presence is now open (Hebrews 10:19) and God's covenant with Israel has not been forgotten.
4. One Temple will be built on the Temple Mount in Jerusalem, possibly even before the Rapture. This Tribulation Temple will be defiled by the Abomination of Desolation. There will be another Temple in Jerusalem during the 1000 year earthly kingdom of Christ. You can read about this Millennial Temple in Ezekiel 40-48.
5.
 - 1) They are two powerful leaders of the 144,000 Jewish evangelists, witnessing in the spirit and power of Moses and Elijah.
 - 2) They are literally Moses and Elijah, based on predictions that Elijah would precede the Messiah.
 - 3) They are literally Elijah and Enoch, because these two Old Testament saints never died.

discuss\ consider

1. Discuss what you know about the history of the Tabernacle and Temples from Old Testament times until now. How do you think the Jewish public will respond to a rebuilt Temple in Jerusalem?
2. The two witnesses were martyred after they finished their testimony. They were immortal as long as they had work to do. The same is true of us; discuss what this does and does not mean.

challenge

Read Psalm 2, understanding its context is praise to God that the time has finally come for the judgment of the damned and the reward of the righteous.

memorize

"Rise and measure the temple of God, the altar, and those who worship there." Revelation 11:1

"And I will give power to my two witnesses, and they will prophesy one thousand two hundred and sixty days, clothed in sackcloth." Revelation 11:3

**The Miraculous Protection and Deliverance of

2. Who does the woman in this vision represent? Who does the child represent?
3. Why is this woman not a representation of the Church or the Virgin Mary?
4. What happens when Satan and his fallen angels rebel against Michael, the holy arch angel, and his angelic forces? When does this rebellion occur?
5. What is Satan's plan of action following his rebellion?

answers

1. John saw the Ark of the Covenant through the open doors of the temple in heaven.
2. The woman represents the nation of Israel; the child is the Lord Jesus Christ Himself.
3. The Church will be in heaven with the Lord during the Tribulation Period. The description of the woman being persecuted and fleeing into the wilderness does not fit the Virgin Mary.
4. Satan and his angels are defeated and they are thrown out of the heavenly realms down to this earth. We believe this will occur at the middle of the Tribulation Period, at the beginning of the Great Tribulation.
5. Knowing that he only has a short time, Satan persecutes the nation of Israel, especially the godly remnant of Jewish believers.

discuss\ consider

1. "God has not thrown out His promises to the Jewish people." Why is this such an important theological truth? What can this teach us about the character of our God?
2. Satan is called "the accuser of the brethren." Discuss how he accuses all believers before God day and night. Now read and rejoice over 1 John 2:1. The Lord is our Advocate. He gave His own life to declare us righteous.

challenge

The next time you feel weighed down by Satan's accusations over your past sins, thank the Lord that our accuser is no match for our Advocate.

memorize

4. Which four world empires are represented in the vision of four beasts in Daniel 7?
5. Why does the whole earth marvel and follow after the beast?

answers

1. With great wrath, Satan will persecute believers and many will be martyred. The special focus of Satan's wrath will be the nation of Israel, God's chosen people.
2. He raises two notorious end time leaders – the beast out of the sea and the beast out of the land.
3. This probably represents the sea of Gentile nations, as it often does in Scripture. Thus this first beast will be a Gentile.
4.
 - Babylon
 - Medo-Persia
 - Greece
 - Rome
5. Because he receives a mortal wound that is healed (verses 3,14).

discuss\ consider

1. Compare John's vision of the beast of the sea and Daniel's vision of four beasts in Daniel 7 (specifically the fourth beast in verses 7,8). Review how this beast becomes the ruler of the ten-kingdom revived Roman Empire. Refer also to Revelation 17:8,12.
2. Read Revelation 13:9-10. Those who persecute believers will not get way with it – then or now. God blesses and commends believers who are persecuted in the faith. Do you pray regularly for persecuted believers?

challenge

Many different views have been taken on the number 666 down through Church History. Don't try to figure out this number. Believers living during the future Tribulation will recognize this leader for sure.

memorize

“And I saw a beast rising up out of the sea, having seven heads and ten horns, and on his horns ten crowns, and on his heads a blasphemous name.” Revelation 13:1

answers

1. The beast comes up out of the sea, which likely represents the sea of Gentile nations. This first beast represents an end-time political ruler who will head up the Revived Roman Empire of the last days.
2. The prophetic visions in Daniel 2 and 7 are similar to descriptions of the first beast here in Revelation. It is clear from Daniel that this beast represents Rome. This beast with its ten horns will continue until the time of the end, and the Lord Himself will conquer the beast when He sets up His kingdom on this earth. We refer to the end-time stage of this beast as the Revived Roman Empire.
3. The first beast, the second beast, and the dragon
4. They will not be able to buy or sell. Ultimately it will show they did not have allegiance to the beast.
5. The first beast gives authority to the second beast, and the second beast directs worship to the first beast.

discuss\ consider

1. The second beast of Revelation 13 is called the false prophet because he directs worship to the first beast. Discuss the supernatural signs he will perform. What is the source of his power? Why are people so easily deceived by supernatural signs?
2. Is the first or second beast of Revelation 13 the Antichrist? Both of the beasts are antichrist (against Christ), but either one could be the Antichrist. Discuss the various reasons given.

challenge

Be cautious of those who claim power to perform signs and wonders. Remember what the Lord said in Matthew 7:21-23.

memorize

“And he deceives those who dwell on the earth by those signs which he was granted to do in the sight of the beast, telling those who dwell on the earth to make an image to the beast who was wounded by the sword and lived.” Revelation 13:14

questions

1. What did we learn about the 144,000 in Revelation 7?
2. Why are the 144,000 called the “first fruits”?
3. What role will Babylon play in end-time events?
4. What is the harvest of grain in Revelation 14?
5. What is the vintage of the grapes in Revelation 14?

answers

1. These 144,000 are Jewish believers of the Tribulation Period, 12,000 from each tribe of Israel. They are probably evangelists spreading the gospel of the kingdom worldwide, and they are sealed and protected from death during their time of service. These people are not the Church, which is in heaven during the Tribulation Period.
2. Other Jewish and Gentile believers will also live through the Tribulation Period to enter alive into the Millennial Kingdom of Christ, but the 144,000 are the first.
3. End-time Babylon will be the center of the one world religion and the one world government of the last days. We read more about the judgment of Babylon in Revelation 17-18.
4. The harvest of grain probably corresponds to Matthew 13:30 – the separation of the wheat and the tares at the end of the age.
5. The vine of the earth commonly refers to the nation of Israel in Scripture. In the last days a great number of Jewish people will turn to the Lord (Romans 11). Zechariah 13:9 teaches that this will be one-third of the nation. The other two-thirds of the nation who continue to reject Jesus as the Messiah will be cut off and judged.

discuss\ consider

1. “The gospel has always been a response in faith to the one true God.” Discuss how this is true in Old Testament times, now in the Church Age, and in the future Tribulation Period.
2. The doctrine of Hell is not a pleasant doctrine, but it is a truth which is critical to the justice of God. Hell is a place of eternal punishment for the damned. It is not annihilation of the damned, and there is no escape from Hell. Discuss why this is an important doctrine.

challenge

Will you rest from your labors when you meet the Lord? You can't rest from your labors if you haven't labored! Your works can't follow you for reward if you haven't worked or done anything. Will you rest from your labors?

memorize

“Behold, a Lamb standing on Mount Zion, and with Him one hundred and forty-four thousand, having His Father's name written on their foreheads.” Revelation 14:1

answers

1.

- The Seven Seal Judgments – Revelation 6-8
- The Seven Trumpet Judgments – Revelation 8-11
- The Seven Bowl Judgments – Revelation 16

2.

- Some commentators overlap the trumpet and bowl judgments so that both begin at the start of the Great Tribulation and end at the end. In this view the trumpet judgments are written on the front of the seal scroll and the bowl judgments are written on the back side; they run simultaneously.
- The other view is that the bowl judgments follow the trumpet judgments in rapid succession, giving great intensity to the end of the Great Tribulation. In this sense they are all considered as happening at about the same time as the sounding of the seventh trumpet of judgment.

3. We don't. That is why we must not be dogmatic in our interpretation. We will know for sure when they occur in the future.

4. This is a heavenly scene (compare Revelation 4:6). The people standing on the sea of glass are believers who were victorious over the beast and did not receive his mark or his number 666. Specifically these martyrs are from the Great Tribulation, the second half of the seven year Tribulation Period.

5. In that chapter we saw martyrs from the first half of the Tribulation Period. Now the company of the Tribulation martyrs is complete and they all join together in song.

discuss\ consider

1. Read the Song of Moses in Exodus 15. This song praises God for His victory over the pagan gods and His redemption and deliverance of His people from Egypt. Discuss how the Tribulation martyrs could identify with this song of praise. How do you identify with it?

2. Some readers of Revelation think the judgments upon the earth are unfair. But there are many elements here that show that the vengeance of God upon this earth is just and fair. Discuss this issue.

challenge

Although the Tribulation martyrs will undergo great hardship and persecution, they sing praises to God. Do you respond with an attitude of praise when you're face with trials and tribulation?

memorize

"Great and marvelous are Your works,

Lord God Almighty!

Just and true are Your ways,

O King of the saints!

Who shall not fear You, O Lord, and glorify Your name?

answers

1. At the end of Revelation 15, seven angels come out of the Temple of God in heaven carrying seven golden bowls full of the wrath of God.
2. Bowl #1: People who had received the mark of the beast and worshiped his image, are incapacitated with loathsome and malignant, ulcerous sores.
Bowl #2: The entire sea is turned to blood and every living creature in the sea dies.
Bowl #3: All of the rivers and springs of water on earth become blood.
Bowl #4: There is an intense heat from the sun so that people are scorched and burned.
Bowl #5: Darkness comes upon the kingdom of the beast.
Bowl #6: The Euphrates River is dried up so that huge armies from the Far East can gather together with the rest of the world's armies in Israel.
Bowl #7: There are geologic events of catastrophic proportions.
3. No, they blaspheme God instead.
4. Because the unrepentant are eternally unrepentant.

discuss\ consider

1. Although some people think these judgments are unfair, the holy angel and the righteous martyrs praise God for His wrath upon those who rejected the message of the saints and prophets. How do you respond to God's righteous judgment?
2. To the unbeliever the return of the Lord will be like a thief coming in the night, and they will be caught off guard. If you are a believer, the rapture of the Church should not be a surprise. Are you ready? Are you awake? Are you walking in righteousness? Or will you be ashamed when the Lord returns, because you are asleep and involved in sin?

challenge

Praise God that because of His saving grace, you are not one of the unrepentant who will experience the wrath of God and will still continue to blaspheme Him!

memorize

"You are righteous, O Lord, The One who is and who was and who is to be, Because You have judged these things. For they have shed the blood of saints and prophets, and You have given them blood to drink. For it is their just due." Revelation 16:5-6

answers

1. Babylon is the word used for the one-world religion and one world government of the end times. Revelation 17 addresses the religious side of end-time Babylon, and chapter 18 addresses the commercial side.
2. Since ancient Babylon was the focus of the total culture of world religion and commerce against the one true God, it is certainly possible that this ancient city will be restored in the end times. Or end time Babylon could simply be symbolic of world religion and commerce against God. In this case, the literal city of Revelation 17:18 would probably be Rome.
3. The false religious system is portrayed as a prostitute; the true Church is the bride of Christ.
4. This beast is the same as the first beast of Revelation 13. This is the 666 character of the Revived Roman Empire.
5. Because she has control over them, as represented by Babylon riding the beast. But the beast is ultimately able to overthrow Babylon, the great religious system of the end times, and make her desolate.

discuss\ consider

1. Think of all the evil that has been done in the name of false religion throughout human history. Satan is delighted when false religion leads people away from the true way of salvation.
2. The details of this prophecy can be complicated and possibly confusing. Review what you have learned in this lesson. Religious Babylon will be overthrown by the beast of the end times. And praise the Lord, the beast also will be overthrown – by the Lord Himself.

challenge

If you are a believer, you are called, chosen, and faithful.

memorize

“I saw the woman, drunk with the blood of the saints and with the blood of the martyrs of Jesus.” Revelation 17:6

answers

1. Babylon is the one world religion and one world government of the end times; the name refers to both the city and the system.
2. The birds represent false religious sects and cults including the occult (see Matthew 13).
3. Religious Babylon will be overthrown in the middle of the Tribulation Period. Commercial Babylon will be judged at the end of the Tribulation Period, under the seventh bowl judgment.
4. Because their source of wealth and profit is gone
5. The Times of the Gentiles began with Babylon's invasion of Jerusalem under Nebuchadnezzar in 605 BC. The Times of the Gentiles will end with the destruction of Babylon at the end of the Tribulation Period, just before the Lord returns.

discuss\ consider

1. Babylon is the evil system that began back at the Tower of Babel when people turned away from God to make a name for themselves. This is the evil system of world religion and world politics that persecuted and killed the saints throughout history. In one hour this evil system will be overthrown by our mighty God. What response does this evoke in you?

challenge

When the people witness the destruction of end time Babylon, they will weep because their investments will be going up in smoke. How are you sending your investments ahead by using them for the Lord? Everything else will go up in smoke.

memorize

"Babylon the great is fallen, is fallen, and has become a dwelling place of demons, a prison for every foul spirit, and a cage for every unclean and hated bird!" Revelation 18:2

 - The martyrs of the Tribulation Period
 - The 24 elders and the 4 living creatures
 - All of heaven
5. Before the Marriage Supper, believers from the Church Age will stand before the Judgment Seat of Christ to be rewarded for their good deeds of Christian service. These righteous acts will contribute to the beautiful garment of the bride.

discuss\ consider

1. Discuss why the Church does not include all believers of all time. The Church began at Pentecost and was raptured home to heaven before the Tribulation Period began. The Church is the body and bride of Christ. What other groups of believers will be invited to the Marriage Supper of the Lamb?
2. The purpose of prophecy is to show how Christ is the focal point of history. We should not study prophecy just to know the future or be captivated by end-time scenarios. All of God’s plans for a fallen world center on the glorification of Christ as the Savior of the world. Have you seen this from your study of Revelation?

challenge

Hallelujah, Praise the Lord! Look for something today that will prompt you to praise the Lord.

memorize

“Alleluia! For the Lord God Omnipotent reigns! Let us be glad and rejoice and give Him glory, for the marriage of the Lamb has come, and His wife has made herself ready.” Revelation 19:6-7

answers

1. The Marriage Supper of the Lamb
2. No! Under the first seal judgment of Revelation 6 the first horseman of the apocalypse is the false world leader, the Roman beast with the number 666. Here in Revelation 19 the rider is the Lord Himself, the Faithful and True Word of God.
3. This is the staging area for what the enemy armies believe will be the conquering of Jerusalem, but they do not know that the Lord Himself will return and defeat them.
4. No, the exact scenario of the precise sequencing of all the details associated with our Lord's Return is not that easy to put together. There is room for discussion because a number of Scriptures must be harmonized.

discuss\ consider

1. Many Christians emphasize that God is love much more than that God is holy. How do you think this has affected society's view of God? Do you think Christians are sometimes embarrassed to talk about the holiness of God and the doctrine of hell? What should our attitude be about speaking of hell to unbelievers?

challenge

Remember to tell people that you come into contact with this week that God is holy as well as God is love.

memorize

"Now I saw heaven opened, and behold, a white horse. And He who sat on him was called Faithful and True, and in righteousness He judges and makes war." Revelation 19:11

4. Outline how the first resurrection comes in three stages, like a harvest.
5. Who will join Satan in the final rebellion at the end of the Millennial Kingdom?

answers

1. Because the Lord Jesus will reign on this earth as king for a literal 1,000 years.
2. The amillennial view takes a non-literal position on Christ's kingdom. They would say that Christ is reigning now in heaven and even here on this earth, in a spiritual sense, because the Lord is king and reigns in the hearts of all believers who make up the kingdom of Christ. The view taught in this study is called "premillennial" because Christ will return before the literal 1,000 year reign.
3. "Death" means separation. The first death is physical death – separation of the soul and spirit from the body. The second death is spiritual death – eternal separation of the soul and spirit from God.
4.
 - Stage 1\First fruits: The Resurrection of Christ (1 Corinthians 15:23)
 - Stage 2\Harvest: The Rapture of the Church
 - Stage 3\Gleanings: The Resurrection of the martyred Tribulation Saints
5. Many people will be born during the Millennium and not all will become believers. They will be born with sinful natures like us all, and even under the benevolent reign of Christ, their sinful heart of man will rebel.

discuss\ consider

1. What do you know of the debate between premillennial and amillennial theology? Review conflicting interpretations from this passage about Satan being bound. Your stance on this important area of theology will affect your interpretation of literally hundreds of passages of Scripture.
2. Our society wants us to believe that man is essentially good. It is said that given the right environment and lack of social pressure, man would only choose and do what is right. How does the rebellion at the end of the Millennium refute this claim? Do you agree that man is essentially evil and is born with a sin nature?

challenge

You don't want to be judged at the Great White Throne Judgment! This judgment is for unbelievers – will you be there?

memorize

answers

1. Revelation 21 teaches about the Eternal State, which follows the millennial reign of Christ.
2. They will be completely cleansed and purified with fire according to 2 Peter 3. This will make way for the New Heavens and New Earth.
3. This does not match the description of the earthly Jerusalem during the Millennial Kingdom, described in Ezekiel 40-48. One theory is that the New Jerusalem will hover over the earth and the earthly Jerusalem during the Millennium and will make its full descent to New Earth for the Eternal State.
4. The names of the 12 tribes of Israel on the gates show that the New Jerusalem is the eternal home of redeemed Israel. The names of the 12 apostles on the foundation stones show that the New Jerusalem is the eternal home of the Church.

discuss\ consider

1. Discuss the many things that will **not** be in the Eternal State. Discuss the many wonderful things that will be in the Eternal State.
2. Look at John 14:2. The Lord said He was preparing a place for us, and it is the New Jerusalem. The New Jerusalem will be the home of all the redeemed in the eternal state. Discuss how you imagine it will be to live together with all the redeemed people from throughout history. What are you looking forward to most?

challenge
